The screenwriter/auteur began his career in 1992 with Reservoir Dogs, and his eighth film, The Hateful Eight, will be released on Christmas Day. But Fans are worried that The Hateful Eight will be Tarantino's last film. Why should this be the case? Well, the film was almost not made, for one thing. The script was leaked in early 2014, long before the film went into production, and Tarantino was not happy. He vowed that he wouldn't make the film, and there were fears that the experience had made him shimmer. But Tarantino eventually changed his mind and continued production. But will he be back in charge after the ordeal? Probably. Tarantino has given a few different reasons when and why he will retire from filmmaking, but fortunately nothing he said really fits with The Hateful Eight as his last film. At first he was quoted as saying that he wanted to retire after ten films. He seems to like the idea of having a simple ten films with common themes, and he doesn't want to be the guy who still makes movies beyond his best world and appeases his reputation. Here's what he said during an appearance at the American Film Market last year, as recorded by Deadline. I don't think you should stay on stage until people ask you to get out. I like the idea of wanting them a bit more. I think directing is a young man's game, and I like the idea of an umbilical cord connection from my first to my last movie. I'm not trying to mock someone who thinks differently, but I want to go out while I'm still tough. ... I like that I'm going to leave a 10-movie movie, so I have two more to go after. It is not set in stone, but that is the plan. When I get to the 10th, do a good job and don't screw it up, it sounds like a good way to end my old career. If I come across a good movie later, I won't do it just because I said I wouldn't. But 10 and done so they want more — that sounds right. So clear Tarantino leaves himself some leeway and says that he can return to the director's chair even after his ten films, if he finds something else. So that's certainly good news for Tarantino fans that he never say never approach, but what if he doesn't even make it to ten movies? Tarantino shot The Hateful Eight on 70mm film for ultra panavision widescreen, but very few people will be able to see the film as it intended. After all, there are hardly any theatres left by the projectors, which can show a 70mm film role due to the almost universal switch to digital projectors, and Tarantino despises the change. He believes that digital projection is no different from television, and showing films in this way eliminates the need to see them in the theater. He explained that if he is no longer able to make films on film and is forced to become digital, he will simply no longer make films. At Comic-Con last year, as The Hollywood Reporter reported, he said: We've ceded too much to the Barbarians. I haven't worked for 20 years to see Are. This is not the film industry I signed up for ... If I can't shoot on film, if I can't publish on movie ... we will see what happens. At the same event, Tarantino also left a window open for The Hateful Eight to be his last film, saying there was a way to combine his planned final two films into an equally long tv miniseries. Although I don't see how an end to his career on television would be satisfying for him, given how he railed against digital production. He said of the possibility: Maybe there are 10 movies, but three mini-series for television. My scripts are truncated anyway. If I've written a script and it's eight hours, then we're all good. As it stands, it seems highly unlikely that The Hateful Eight is Quentin Tarantino's last film, but you never know. He can be so fed up with script leaks and digital conversions that he decides enough is enough. So you should probably go to see The Hateful Eight in theaters while you can. And please, see it in 70mm. However, professional action is very competitive and not everyone will succeed. If your goals include millions of dollars for a single movie role and the lead role in a summer blockbuster, the chances of that are pretty slim. But with the right training, talent and effort, you can create a career as a professional actress. Actors often work in unstable environments, and pay can be very unpredictable. You could audition for months just to land a job that lasts only one day, which makes it very difficult to earn a stable enough income to pay your bills every month. It is common for actresses to keep more than one job while looking for roles. Longer periods of unemployment between jobs are also common. Even if you score a job, you probably won't get rich unless you're part of a tiny minority of actresses. The average hourly wage for actors in 2010 was USD 17.44, according to the Bureau of Labor Statistics. This was not so much higher than the median of 16.27 US dollars for all occupations. BLS expects that the employment of the actors will grow by only 4 percent between 2010 and 2020, well below the 14 percent growth rate forecast for all jobs. Unfortunately, there is a lack of meaty, career-making roles for in traditional Hollywood movies, according to a 2011 Reuters article. Actresses are often required to meet unrealistic standards of beauty and physique, especially compared to their male counterparts. If a woman doesn't have a special look, she might find it difficult to find work in high-profile film and TV projects. Male actors also tend to earn more than women, and are more likely to find a steady job as they get older. Although there is little chance of making it great as an actress, draw a different image to score customers, according to the Screen Actors Guild. Beware of agents and managers who charge you for their services with the promise to accompany you directly to the star as an actress. The odds are certainly against you if your dream is to star in Hollywood blockbusters or take the lead role in a successful and long-running TV series. However, it is possible to make a living by taking jobs in professional theatre productions, speaking for ads and voiceovers and working as an extra. You can help your chances by further refining your craft through acting classes and workshops. You should also put together a portfolio of your work and network at industry events. No one can completely rule out that you'll get a big career break, so if you stick with it and accept work, it seems, the payout could be positive. It's important to remember that talent is just one component to make it as an actress. They must also be professional, prepared and determined. If you are easily discouraged by rejection, this is not the profession for you. They could be rejected for 20 roles before you land one, so stamina -- and a short memory -- are important traits.
